Purpose of Role	<p>Overview of the Role</p> <p>The ICT Analyst & Design Lead will work as part of the Applications team in developing innovative solutions to support the work of Tusla and assist staff in maximising the use of technology to work efficiently and effectively. The role will primarily have responsibility for the analysis and design as well as user acceptance phases of the software development life cycle (SDLC). The role will involve working with business representatives to develop requirements/ design proposals and lead on all aspects of documentation throughout the SDLC.</p> <p>Tusla’s ICT Application Development Architecture</p> <p>Tusla have a highly skilled internal application development team delivering solutions in .NET Core and Angular in the Azure environment as well as the Power Platform. The team works through Azure DevOps and the cross functional team contains Business Analysts, Developers, Architects and Testers</p>
